

ON THE WAY....



"I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Those word of Jesus set out a job description for those of us who are his followers. To be true to his message, we need to be living, sharing, promoting a more abundant life. Who wouldn't want an abundant life! Yet, despite this attractive message the Catholic Church is losing members at an alarming rate. There are currently about 70 million Catholics in the US – the largest religious group. The second largest: former Catholics, numbering about 44 million. What is going on?

If ATT lost 44 million customers they would do a deep analysis of their products and their promotion and make whatever changes were necessary to get them back. If attendance at the Disney Parks dropped by 44 million they would seek to improve the experience of those who attended and would launch a major ad campaign. Such drastic drops in numbers requires making changes. And, as the example of Sears demonstrates, the changes demand more than consolidation and closing sites.

Cardinal Cupich looks at these numbers and is alarmed. His response has been the Renew My Church initiative. He uses the words "parish vitality" as the desired end of the process. St. James will begin taking part in the process in the months to come. All of us should stay involved to ensure the vitality of our parish. A vital parish is one which will attract others to join with us in the journey of faith.

In the meantime there are some things we need to do in order to demonstrate the "more abundant life" that Jesus brings to us in faith. A three-fold approach should focus our energies: matter, medium, message. The matter of faith is, in one sense, given to us. We have our creeds and beliefs as Catholics. However, as Pope Francis has proven framing the message differently can show how wonderful it means to be a believer. Emphasizing the mercy of God as the starting point for understanding the faith shifts the conversation about Catholicism into the place where it belongs, the love of God.

The medium of faith is, of course, us. The Catholic faithful are the ones who provide the human face of God. We need to ask ourselves if we do, in fact, exhibit a more abundant life. The primary place people will see that is in our worship. When we gather as a people of God do we show forth the love, joy, peace, compassion of Jesus. But being Church is not limited to our time in prayer. We also re-orient our priorities to make sure that we are including everyone in our circle of care, particularly the most vulnerable, those who are in need.

The message of a more abundant life is not about a slick media campaign. Rather, it is a one-on-one sharing of that life that each one of us are part of. In our homes, our workplaces, our schools, our neighborhood we need to live in a way that shows others the richness of the abundant life in Jesus.


