



JULY 14, 2019 15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ON THE WAY.....

May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Today is Bastille Day when French people all over the world celebrate a holiday that honors democracy and equality in France. It commemorates the traditional opening of the French Revolution in 1789. The king was overthrown and a republic was declared. "Liberty, equality, and fraternity" became the motto of the new republic. Less well known than this story of freedom is the undercurrent of violence against Catholics that the French Revolution unleashed. Thousands were killed simply because they were Catholics.

For example, one martyr was a Christian Brother (the community that staffs De La Salle), Brother Salomon Leclercq. Following the promulgation of the Civil Constitution of the Clergy, which gave the state control over the Church in France, he refused – along with most Lasallians – to take the required oath. He was arrested on August 1, 1792 on suspicion of counter-revolutionary activism and imprisoned in Paris along with many bishops, priests and religious. On September 2, he and other church figures were killed by sword blow in the garden of the convent. Salomon Leclercq thus became the first martyr for the Christian Brothers. 191 people, comprising three bishops, 127 secular priests, 56 religious and five lay people, and including Salomon Leclercq who were killed that day, have since been recognized as martyrs of the faith.

Four Daughters of Charity from Arras as well as eleven Ursulines from Valenciennes, were condemned to death for having "taught the Roman, Catholic and apostolic religion" and were guillotined on October 23, 1794. In 1925, Pius XI beatified another 32 religious women from Orange, who had been beheaded on July 9, 1794 for allegedly "having wished to destroy the Republic by fanaticism and superstition." Fr Noel Pinot was guillotined in his priestly vestments on February 21, 1794 for having recused the Constitutional oath.

827 priests and religious were imprisoned on hulks (old ships no longer sea-worthy and used for storage, jails, hospitals, etc.) at Rochefort, France to await exile. There they were basically ignored to death as there was little provision for food and water, less for sanitation, and none at all for medical help. 542 of the prisoners died there.

The Martyrs of Compiègne were the 16 members of the Carmel of Compiègne, France: 11 Discalced Carmelite nuns, three lay sisters, and two externs (tertiaries of the Order, who would handle the community's needs outside the monastery.) They refused to obey the Civil Constitution of the Clergy of the Revolutionary government, which mandated the suppression of their monastery. The Carmelite community was transported to Paris, where they were condemned as a group as traitors and sentenced to death. They were sent to the guillotine on Thursday, 17 July 1794. At the foot of the scaffold, the community jointly renewed their religious vows and sang the Veni Creator Spiritus. One of the nuns then began to sing a hymn as she mounted the steps of the scaffold, which the rest of the community took up. Some accounts state that they sang the Salve Regina, accorded a special place in the Carmelite Order. They continued their singing as, one by one, they mounted the scaffold to meet their death.
