

JULY 21, 2019 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

This icon was written (icons are written, not painted) by a Russian monk, Andre Rublev, in the fifteenth century, as a homage to the Holy Trinity. It is based on the mysterious appearance of three travelers

to Abraham and Sarah under the oak of Mamre. Abraham and his wife Sarah entertained the three angels in the shade of an oak when Abraham came to understand that the angels were the embodiment of God in three faces. In later ages, Christians came to recognize the scene from Genesis as foreshadowing the Trinity.

The icon depicts the Holy Trinity in the form of three angels, rather than depicting the classic Father, Son and Holy Spirit as old bearded man, Jesus and the dove. It most fully expresses the dogma of the Holy Trinity: the three angels are depicted in equal dignity, symbolizing the Trinity and equality of all three Persons. The three angels are depicted as seated around an altar in the center of which there is a chalice of the Eucharist with the head of a sacrificial calf which symbolizes the lamb of the New Testament, i.e., Christ. The first angel is the first person of the Trinity – God the Father; the second, middle angel is God the Son (the two fingers extended symbolize the dual nature, divine and human); the third angel is God the Holy Spirit. The left and center angels bless the chalice. God the Father blesses God the Son for death on the cross in the name of love for people. God the Holy Spirit (the right angel) is present here to provide comfort, confirming the high logic of sacrificial, all-forgiving love. According to the icon the Holy Trinity is the embodiment of spiritual unity, peace, harmony, mutual love and humility.

Rublev's genius lay in his decision to reject most of the traditional elements which are found in the depiction of the Abraham and Sarah story of hospitality. He does not show Abraham, or Sarah, or the calf's slaughter, nor does he show any details of the meal. And the angels are shown talking, not eating. Rublev makes the silent communion of the three angels the center of the composition and the essence of the Trinity. It is an ideal representation of God, without God actually being represented.
