

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"SEND ME!"



The conjunction of today's first reading and next week's visit to St. James by Bishop Perry is nothing short of lovely. In the reading from Isaiah 6 in today's mass, the prophet is in the temple and there receives a vision of the glory of the Lord. The glory fills the temple. Sixwinged seraphs spread incense throughout the building as they swing their thuribles. The

prophet, overcome by the sense of his own sinfulness in the presence of God's holiness, confesses himself a sinner and has his lips burned clean by a charcoal taken from the fire. And finally, when he hears the Lord ask his court: "Whom shall I send? Who will speak for me?" he steps forward, no less a sinner but now one consumed with zeal for the Lord, and he cries out, "Here I am! Send me!"

If we take a look at Bishop Perry's coat-of-arms and his episcopal motto, it is obvious that he has made this scripture passage his own – it has become personal for him. On the shield we see the worship thurible giving off the incense that signals God's holiness and presence. We see the six wings, an unmistakable reference to the seraphim. And the motto beneath the shield is the prophet's own cry of "Send me, O Lord!"

We are not Bishop Perry, nor do we have a coat-of-arms and motto as he does. And yet as we listen to him next week and receive with joy the good news he brings about a brighter future and possibilities for St. James, we could do a lot worse than hear again the words of the prophet in the presence of God and take them to heart. St. James has received a great gift, a great grace, a clear sign of the Lord's favor and generosity. We could just take it in stride, think something like "It's about time something good happened here!", and go on about our business as if not much has been changed beyond our having now some reassurance about our future.

Or – and this would be the much better way – we could take it as the prophet took it and as the bishop's shield and motto suggest that we take it. The prophet knows his own sinfulness (there is no false modesty here) and he knows that he is unworthy to be a witness to God's holiness and goodness. He knows that nothing he has received is owed to him by God, but rather it all is grace, it is all pure gift from a loving God whose generosity we cannot imagine. And so the prophet does not just receive it as his due, as something that is no big deal. He receives it as a call on God's part to dedicate himself to the beauty he has seen in the temple and to give his life in the Lord's service.

St. James, as it receives much, is now called upon to give much, to respond with lives of service, as did the prophet and as did the disciples in today's gospel. This is no thing that just allows us to continue on as before, only now we breathe easier. No, this changes everything, as is the case in the life of grace of every prophet and disciple. By this grace, we belong to him more now than ever before, and we should expect that this grace will change our lives, and renew our parish. Or at least it should and will if we do not stand in the way. It will not be easy. But then, did we really want it to be?
