FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Many people mentioned a desire for Bible study in the recent parish survey. Before we begin the study of Scripture let me suggest that we spend some time praying with Scripture. One method for doing so is called *lectio divina* or holy reading. This is an ancient style of prayer developed in the monasteries and in use for over one thousand years. The instinct behind this prayer is that the Word of God is addressed to each of us individually. We need to spend some time regularly quieting our own thought process to become open to what God wishes to say to us. This prayer style encourages an encounter with the Word that leads to a prayerful dialogue with God.

Lectio divina is a simple four step process. First, lectio or reading the Word. Choose a passage of Scripture for prayer and read the passage for the first time. Aim for a small, bite-sized passage. How do you understand the scene? Next, read the passage aloud as though telling a story to others. Then read the passage a third time and ask what image, concept or word from the passage strikes you.

Second step, *meditatio* or chewing on the Word. Wrestle with the image, word or concept that struck you in the Scripture passage. How does the image, word or concept touch your life? What does the image, word or concept say about my relationship with God, with others, with myself? Upon reflection on the image, word or concept what does that Scripture passage call me to do? How should I respond? Then formulate a question or direction statement that arises from your reflection. Stay with the *meditatio* until you feel you have thoroughly digested the passage.

Third step, *contemplatio* or resting in the Word. After you doing the work of dialoguing with the Word in the *meditatio* it is time to wait for God to work by speaking to us in the silence. Sit patiently and wait for a word from the Lord. This is usually something on the affective level. God moves in our heart more that in the realm of ideas. Notice the promptings of your heart as you rest in the Word. We can feel challenged, affirmed, consoled, confused, repentant, energized, or any other number of ways during this time of silence.

The final step is called *oratio* or praying the Word. During this time we say a brief prayer of gratitude for the movement during the *lectio divina*. This should be a short prayer – like a spear up to heaven as one of the practitioners described it. Then say, AMEN. This concludes the time of prayer. This style of prayer works on the most basic level. Spend just a few minutes with the Bible in order to enrich your day. You don't need to have a sophisticated understanding of the Bible in order to pray the Bible. Take up and read the Word and God will come to dwell within you.


