ON THE WAY....



James was a fairly common name in the Holy Land during New Testament times. James is the Anglicized form of the Old Testament hero, Jacob who led the Chosen People into the Promised Land. There are at least three different men named James who played a crucial role in the spread of the Jesus movement. James, the son of Zebedee and brother of John, was one of the intimates of Jesus. He was with him at many of the crucial events during Jesus' time on earth. According to the Acts of the Apostles he was beheaded by King Herod Agrippa in AD 42. There was a second James, the son of Alphaeus, who is also listed as one of the twelve. One of the witnesses of the crucifixion of Jesus is called "Mary the mother of James the younger" (Mark 15:40). The tradition has presumed the James named here is this second James and for that reason he is known as "James the Less" to distinguish him from James, son of Zebedee, "James the Greater." The Acts of the Apostles also speaks of James, "the brother of the Lord" who was the head of the primitive Christian community in Jerusalem. St. Paul calls him one of the "pillars" of the Church and it is to him that the Epistle of James is ascribed. Outside of the New Testament evidence we know very little about the figures who are mentioned in the Bible. There are many tales and legends which grew up and became popular in the Church's traditions. We hear stories of the twelve apostles going far and wide to spread the Gospel message. The patron of this parish, James the Greater, is supposed to have preached in Spain for several years. He returned to Jerusalem and was then beheaded. According to one legend his disciples then brought him back to Spain where he was buried in what is now Santiago de Compostela. (Another legend has it that angels guided a rudderless, unattended boat to Spain with his body.) There the saint lay unnoticed until the ninth century.

Sometime after the year 800 King Alfonso II discovered the relics of the saint. He took this as a sign that St. James would help him in the re-conquest of Spain from the "Moors," Muslims from North African who had occupied the Iberian peninsula since 710. The King urged pilgrims to visit the tomb of St. James and pray for deliverance from the invaders. Pilgrims responded in droves. Compostela has been a popular destination for pilgrims from that time until this. A beautiful basilica has been built over the site of the saint's tomb that is a fitting climax to the spiritual journey.

In 2014 over one quarter of a million pilgrims were awarded a "Compostela" for having made the pilgrimage by walking at least one hundred miles or bicycling two hundred. You can spot a pilgrim by the presence of a scallop shell, the traditional badge of St. James. The patron of our parish symbolizes for us that we are truly "on the way."


