

ON THE WAY....



Visiting the sick is one of the corporal works of mercy. In the parable of the sheep and the goats Jesus teaches us that when we visit the sick we are caring for him. At St. James we strive to be a parish who demonstrate our care for the sick of the community. One of the tools for caring for the sick is the list we publish in the parish bulletin each week. The goal of this list is to remind us to pray for the sick who are in special need. However, I do not think that the current sick list works as well as it could. The static nature of the list does not promote an active connection with the sick. Therefore, after taking counsel with the pastoral care team and the Parish Council we are instituting a new policy in how we use the parish sick list in the bulletin. The goal of these changes is to improve the care that we extend to our parishioners who are sick.

- The list is the bulletin is meant to keep us close to parish members who are not able to worship with us on a Sunday. Others from outside the parish of our friends and family in need of prayer should be noted in the book of intentions found in the east entrance of the hall
- 2. The sick list will be divided into two parts: the "sick" and the "shut-in."
- 3. The "shut-in" part of the list will include those of our parishioners who because of old age or infirmity are no longer able to attend Mass on Sunday. By its nature this list will remain relatively constant from week to week. The hope is that by naming the shut-ins in this way individual parishioners will stay aware of our absent members and reach out to keep them connected to us in prayer.
- 4. The Liturgy Committee will institute a program so that Eucharistic Ministers will visit those shut-ins who wish to receive Holy Community from our altar on Sunday.
- 5. The parish wants to stay aware of those who are sick. Please call the parish office to ask to be included on the parish sick list.
- 6. The "sick" part of the list will name those who are going through a particular health crisis. This list will be more changeable. Once the immediate crisis is passed (e.g. home from the hospital, chemotherapy completed, rehab accomplished) the name will be removed from the list.

The list in the bulletin this week is the initial effort by the pastoral care team to institute the above policy. Please let us know of any corrections, additions or omissions you notice on the list. The desired end of the policy is that we improve the prayerful connection we have with all of our parishioners – both those able to attend and those who are unable. The parishioners who have born the "heat of the day" are still dear to our heart. Let us deepen the spiritual bonds that we possess as the people of St. James.

Come Join us visiting Brush Creek, Missouri, St. Peter's Church where Father Augustus Tolton was baptized and attended Mass as a child, the adjoining slave cemetery; the city of Quincy, Illinois, where he is buried at St. Peter Cemetery, the corner marker of St. Joseph Church his first pastorate, Quincy University where he attended college and St. Peter Parish where he attended grade school and made his First Holy Communion and Confirmation.
