

ON THE WAY....



The Fourth Sunday of Lent is sometimes called by its Latin title: Laetare Sunday. The word "laetare" means "rejoice" and is the theme of this Sunday taken from Isaiah 66:10, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all be love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning." The vestments are rose colored. The term "rose" is used to describe this lighter shade of the color violet in the Roman Catholic Church. In the western liturgical system, purple is the color of Lenten penance, while white is the color of feast days. Rose is the color of Laetare as the color obtained naturally by mixing purple and white. According to the tradition, this Sunday is considered a day of relaxation from normal Lenten rigors; a day of hope with Easter at last within sight.

Of course the "Lenten rigors" are not as rigorous as they once were. Carnival, which precedes Lent, has at its root two Latin words: "carne" and "vale," translated "good-bye to meat." In days past it was common to give up eating meat for the entire season! Now, the only expectation is that Catholics abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent and on Ash Wednesday. In the modern world we have to remind ourselves that we are in the season of Lent since our practices don't pinch as hard.

All of which suggests that in our day and time we might shift the emphasis of Laetare Sunday. Instead of this being a day of relaxation from our Lenten practice, let us make it a day of renewal of those practices. If you are anything like me, you tend to slip a bit in your observance over the six weeks of the Lenten season. I easily make an excuse not to abide by the resolution I kept so carefully during the first days of Lent. On this Sunday, as we turn more directly toward Easter, let us resolve to keep our Lenten penances vigorously for the next three weeks.

Another Catholic curiosity about Laetare Sunday – on this day a golden rose is blessed by the Holy Father in Rome. The Golden Rose symbolizes the Risen Christ of glorious majesty. (The Messiah is hailed "the flower of the field and the lily of the valleys" in the Bible.) In historical times, the Golden Rose was conferred upon the wives or daughters of Catholic rulers who had supported the papacy in times of trouble. In recent years, the Gold Rose has been presented to Churches or Shrines that help to promote the Petrine ministry. For example, Pope Benedict XVI during the eight years while he was pope gave away eighteen roses, all of them to Marian Shrines around the world. In 2008 the Holy Father gave a golden rose to the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. Pope Francis has bestowed two golden roses, in 2013 to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico and in 2016 to the Black Madonna of Częstochowa in Poland.



What to Bring

- · For married filing joint, both spouses must be present
- All Forms W-2 and 1099
- · Information for other income
- · Information for all deductions/credits
- · A copy of last year's tax return
- · Proof of account for direct deposit of refund
- Social Security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification notices/cards for you, your spouse, and/or dependents
- · Proof of identification for yourself and/or your spouse
- . Total paid to day care provider and their tax ID number
- Birth dates for you, spouse and/or dependents on the return
- · Proof of foreign status if applying for ITIN
- Forms 1095-A, B or C (Affordable Health Care Statements)
- For prior year or returns, copies of income transcripts from IRS (and state, if applicable)
