


# SAINT JAMES CATHOLIC CHURCH

## ON THE WAY....



During the fifty days of Easter in the place where you would ordinarily find an Old Testament or an epistle the reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. The instinct of the season is that it is simply not sufficient to tell of what God did for Jesus on that first Easter Sunday. Rather the meaning of Easter is only understood when we see how the Resurrection impacted the followers of Jesus. We see in the Acts of the Apostles what it means to be Easter people.

The characteristics of those first followers of Jesus are idealized by St. Luke (the author of Acts) but they do serve as a yardstick against which we can measure ourselves. According to Acts 2:42-47 the Easter people 1) devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles, 2) were committed to the common good, 3) dedicated themselves to prayer and "the breaking of the bread" (the Eucharist), 4) helped those who were in need. It was this way of life that was attractive to many people so that "the Lord added to their number."

We, even at the remove of 2,000 years, are Easter people. Those attributes of the early Church are ones we should imitate: 1) catechesis, 2) community, 3) spirituality, 4) service. What the Acts of the Apostles illustrates is that these actions were the power behind the evangelizing mission of the early preaching. St. James has committed itself to being an evangelizing presence in the community. We believe that we can help his world better reflect God's peace and justice by inviting our neighbors to share life in our parish. The activities of the Evangelization Committee are all geared to that end. However, the growth of the Church is not the work of any particular committee or individual. We are all responsible for bringing the good news of Jesus into our world. And we do so primarily not by standing on street corners and handing out flyers but by the quality of our life together.

The founder of my religious congregation, Fr. Thomas A. Judge, C.M., had a saying: "every Catholic is called to be an apostle." But the report of those first apostles in the book of Acts suggests that we are apostles most effectively by how we live, not by what we say. In 1975 Pope Paul VI in his encyclical on evangelization, *EVANGELII NUNTIANDI*, put it this way: "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." And this is not a new phenomenon, when the first generation of converts reported on why they were entering the Church: Look how those Christians love one another. So from many quarters throughout the centuries we are reminded that as we are others will be. The quality of our life together as a Christian people will be the most powerful evangelizing tool in our arsenal.
