

ON THE WAY....



Stewardship implies our way of giving thanks to God. Everything is a gift from God given so this world can become the place of peace and justice that God intends. God counts on us to show gratitude for blessings received by using our gifts wisely. Everything, even life itself, only finds its proper use in promoting our relationship with God. In essence, steward-ship defines our purpose in this world as assigned to us by God Himself. It is our divinely given opportunity to join with God in a worldwide and eternal redemptive movement.

It has become customary in Church circles to speak of three aspects of stewardship: time, talent, and treasure. We exercise our stewardship of treasure but returning a portion of the material blessings we have received toward the needs of the poor and the ongoing work of the Church. Our gift to the Church should reflect a conscious decision to donate a given percentage of income back to God. We exercise our stewardship of talent but getting involved in various projects, programs, and activities where we can apply our talents (whatever they may be) in making this world just a little bit better. Today is your opportunity to make such a commitment. Look over the possibilities. Ask questions. Then sign up!

The stewardship of time gets the least amount of attention but I would propose it is the most important aspect of stewardship. After all, what more precious gift do we have but the gift of time! Think how often we say something like "I was going to get around to it but I ran out of time." "There aren't enough hours in the day." "Time flies when you're having fun." Stewardship of time happens when we are intentional in our use of time. So often we (or I, at least) have the best of intentions but because I didn't carve out specific time to do it, it didn't get done.

Let me suggest that you make up a little chart and post it on your refrigerator with your time commitments. I find it helpful to divide it into daily, weekly and monthly commitments. And, if you are like me, it is helpful to be as specific as possible. You can even create a grid so that you can check off when you have accomplished a specific goal. Some examples of what such a chart might look like:

Each day I will: Spend fifteen minutes in silent prayer. Read one chapter of the Bible. Turn off the TV at 9:00pm so that I can do some reading. Never spend more than 30 minutes playing video games.

Each week I will: Go to church. Call or write at least one old friend to keep a relationship alive. Visit an elderly neighbor or someone in the nursing home. Volunteer to tutor a child or work in the food pantry.

Each month I will: Spend at least one day outdoors in nature renewing my spirit. Do something to nourish my soul – play the guitar, paint a picture, write a poem, go to a play. Go out of my way to introduce myself to a new person.

TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS update.....

One year ago we completed our pledge campaign for the upkeep of the parish and the archdiocese. If you remember the people of St. James were extremely generous in our pledges: \$474,658.



So far people have contributed \$143,541 toward those pledges. Thank you so much for your generosity. Of that amount the parish gets to keep \$86,124, the rest going to programs in the Archdiocese.

We are accepting final bids on the replacing the windows in the hall. They will cost somewhere in the neighborhood of \$100,000. We will sign a contract this fall so that the new windows will be in place before winter.

A word of gratitude to those who have been faithful in the pledges – every blessing. A word of reminder to those who are lagging --honor those pledges as best you can. You help to make the future of St. James.

Mass Stipends




