



JUNE 3, 2018 THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

The preeminent day during the liturgical year to celebrate the gift of the Holy Eucharist is on Holy Thursday. It was on this day at the Last Supper when Jesus gathered his disciples together, broke the bread, shared the cup and said, "This is my body. This is the cup of my blood. Do this in remembrance of me." However, occurring as it does during Holy Week when we remember the entire pageant of Jesus' saving death and resurrection, devotion to the Blessed Sacrament is only one of many of God's might deeds to be aware of. In fact, we also remember at the Last Supper besides the first Eucharist the command of Jesus to wash one another's feet. The Catholic Church also looks on the Last Supper as the occasion when Jesus ordained the apostles as priests. A lot to pack into one day.

Throughout the Church's history a need has been felt at various times for a feast to focus on the Holy Eucharist in a very particular way. This feeling reached a high point in the thirteenth century. St. Juliana of Liege in Belgium (1193-1258) was a Norbertine nun and mystic who



had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist. After many years of trying, she finally convinced her bishop, the who would become in the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, where none had existed before. Soon after her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church. Pope Urban commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia are the beloved hymns the Church sings to this very day on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. We use these hymns (in English translation) at First Friday Devotions here at St. James.

In the current liturgical calendar the feast is celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday or, "where the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ [the official translation of the feast of Corpus Christi] is not a holy day of obligation, [as in the United States] it is assigned to the Sunday after the Most Holy Trinity as its proper day." Which brings us to today. In more Catholic areas this feast day is marked by processions with the Blessed Sacrament paraded through the street held aloft in a golden Monstrance. Benediction is celebrated at specific points along the procession route. The smell of flowers and incense and the singing of songs make for a festive day.

Since Vatican Council II the Church's devotion to the Holy Eucharist has tended to stress the sacramental elements not so much as a things but as actions. Receiving the Body of Christ in Holy Communion transforms us into the Body of Christ as Church. May this Holy Day we one of transformation for us at Saint James.


AT ST. JAMES....
