

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Some religious holidays have morphed into national holidays. Most notably, Christmas is celebrated by all Americans of whatever religious orientation. Some national holidays have adopted a religious overtone. Thanksgiving Day while in origins secular carries a strong religious dimension that Christians celebrate. Mothers' Day and Fathers' Day are somewhat in this latter category. While these are purely national holidays, religious people can celebrate these days since mothers and fathers are important in the life of faith for believers.

The modern holiday of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother. Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, a peace activist during the Civil War, died. Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by continuing the work she started and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the world." In 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating Mother's Day, held on the second Sunday in May, as a national holiday to honor mothers.

Father's Day is a celebration honoring fathers and celebrating fatherhood, paternal bonds, and the influence of fathers in society. In Catholic Europe, it has been celebrated on March 19 (St. Joseph's Day). This celebration was brought by the Spanish and Portuguese to Latin America, where March 19 is often still used for it. Father's Day was not celebrated in the US, outside Catholic traditions, until the 20th century. As a civic celebration in the US, it was inaugurated in the early 20th century to complement Mother's Day by celebrating fathers and male parenting. There are some interesting Chicago roots to this holiday. In 1911, Jane Addams proposed that a citywide Father's Day celebration be held in Chicago, but she was turned down. After hearing a Mothers' Day sermon, Sonora Smart Dodd told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday to honor them. Several local clergymen accepted the idea, and on June 19, 1910, the first Father's Day was held. Dodd



stopped promoting the celebration because she was studying at the Art Institute of Chicago, and it faded into relative obscurity. There was a resistance to establishing Fathers' Day as a national holiday and it was not until 1966, that President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972.

We join with our fellow countryman on this day to honor fathers. However, we are only too aware that 23% of children in the US are living with single mothers. As Christians we must work to supplement the leadership and guidance that a father can provide. Let us use this day as a prod to make sure that all young people are given the paternal direction which will help them succeed in life.
