



ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT


The fiscal year at St. James ends on June 30 (FY 2017-2018). This report includes the operation of the parish, the food pantry and the campus ministry. 
TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS

St. James is almost halfway through the Capital Campaign entitled "To Teach Who Christ Is." In 2016 donors from the parish, 85 in number, pledged \$474,758 to be contributed over a five year period to improve our physical plant. The windows were replaced with monies from this campaign. The next major project is the replacement of the roof with an estimated expense of more than \$100,000. Thanks to all who have contributed.
