

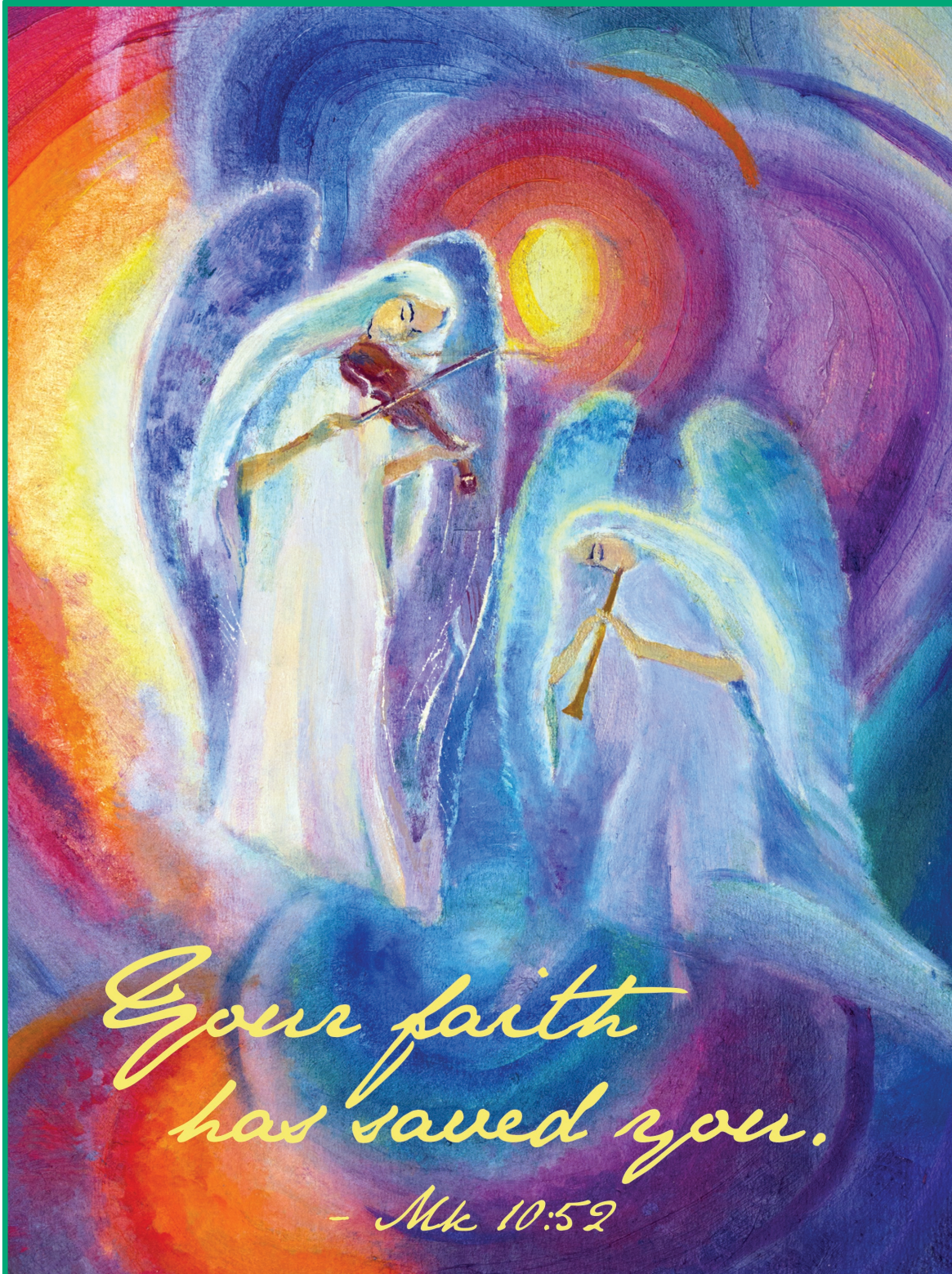

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

St. James can be rightly proud that we celebrate the Eucharist with style and grace. The combination of the Liturgical Ministers' Day and the class on the liturgy entitled *Let Us Break Bread Together* has stirred many thoughts on how we might improve our liturgical celebration. I keep going back to the Vatican II document the CONSTITUTION ON THE SACRED LITURGY entitled in Latin, *SACROSANCTUM CONCILIUM* as a guide to our liturgical renewal. Please excuse a longish quote from paragraph #14 of the document but it seems vitally important:

"Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism. In the restoration and promotion of the sacred liturgy, this full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else; for it is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit; and therefore pastors of souls must zealously strive to achieve it, by means of the necessary instruction, in all their pastoral work."

"Fully conscious and active participation" on the part of "all of the faithful" is "demanded by the very nature of the liturgy." In other words, if you don't have full, conscious and active participation by the congregation, you don't have liturgy! The priest, the deacon, the acolytes, the choir, the lectors, the Eucharistic ministers, the greeters and ushers, the sacristan all have a role to play. However, every liturgical ministry has as its goal the "full and active participation by all the people." There are no spectators at Mass! Everyone is a participant. Many of the things we do during the service – even something as simple as the movement of standing and sitting or the call and response, "The Lord be with you. And also with you," – is designed to keep the assembly involved in the liturgical event. Everything we do must be viewed through the lens of how it connects with the people.

That helps to explain the importance of culture in the renewal of the liturgy. For example, there is a rich heritage of liturgical music in the history of the Church – Gregorian chant or rich polyphony. Dipping into that heritage is appropriate when it helps to promote full and active participation. However, often those historical resources don't connect with the experience of a particular people. It is more appropriate in such an instance to use musical forms and expressions which do, in fact, involve the congregation in "one, great sacrament of praise." The same goes with translations of the Bible, with liturgical vestments, with art and environment. The liturgy demands that we use those things which invite every culture and people into a greater involvement in the prayer of the Church.
