

OCTOBER 7, 2018 27TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

At this trying time in the life of the Church I look to history to provide some sense of perspective. Certainly in the two millennia of the Church's existence there have been many scandalous behaviors: anti-semitism leading to persecution, scandalous popes who accumulated vast wealth for their illegitimate children, opposition to scientific progress as exemplified in the case of Galileo, etc. The scandal of clerical sex abuse ranks right up there with the worst of them. The one piece of consolation is that God has gotten us through terrible times before with a more purified understanding of what it means to be the ecclesia semper reformanda, the church always in need of reform.

In the fourth century the great African bishop, St. Augustine, had to deal with a sinful clergy as well. It caused some people to say that they would leave the Church in order to have only holy priests. Augustine rejected that solution. He wrote to the people: "Listen, sheep of God, listen and learn: God will call the bad shepherds to account for his sheep and for their deaths... I certainly see him taking the sheep from the bad shepherds: I am above the shepherds, and I shall take my flock back from them and I shall not allow them to feed my flock. In this way the shepherds will stop feeding themselves. For when I say to them, "Feed my sheep," they feed themselves and not my sheep. I shall not allow them to feed my flock. How does he stop them from looking after his sheep? Do whatever they say, but do not do what they do. It is as if he were saying, "Their words are my words but their actions are their own." When you avoid what the bad shepherds do, they are not in charge of you any more: when you follow what they say, it is my words you are following and it is I who am tending you."

One relatively easy and common sense reform that the Church should institute to head off the next scandal is to expand those in the room when decisions are made. For example, it is not a surprise what when only priests are in the room.



their sympathies will be for a fellow priest. If there were parents in the room the care of children would rise to the forefront. Since the Church is the people of God, not merely those who are ordained, it is the people of God as a whole who are responsible for the life and health of the Church. The Archdiocese of Chicago has made efforts to expand the consultation it takes with the formation of an Archdiocesan Finance Council, Pastoral Council, Women's Committee, and Youth Council. As important as these consultations are they are more about information than they are deliberation. Investing such Councils, Committees and Board with deliberative authority would lead to decisions which better reflect the reality of the whole Church and not one particular group in the Church. When our ecclesial structures catch up with our theology of the Church as the People of God we will be the better for it.
