ON THE WAY.....





May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

For Catholics the high point of the entire liturgical year occurs during the "Sacred Triduum" – the three days which celebrate the great mystery of our redemption, Christ suffering, death, burial and resurrection. There is a fancy Greek word that helps us understand what we are doing during these days: anamnesis. This refers to a particular kind of remembering. In the liturgy we have a dynamic memory of the events that we celebrate in order to effect how we live in the future. We do not repeat the events of the past as some kind of nostalgia. Rather, we celebrate the importance of these events in our life of faith in order to help us live what we believe. Each day of the Triduum challenges us to look at our lives. How is my life different because of the washing of the feet? How is my life different because of the passion and death of Jesus? How is my life different because of the "light of Christ" we all receive as we renew our baptismal promises?

Holy Thursday calls to mind the Last Supper that Jesus had with his disciples. During that meal he gave us the Eucharist and empowered the apostles to "do this in memory" of him which the Church considers the origins of priestly ordination. Eucharist and priesthood are central themes of the day. In addition, St. John, in his account of the Last Supper tells the story of the most dramatic gesture that Jesus performed washing the feet of his disciples. His example of lexing performed – washing the feet of his disciples. His example of loving service transforms our lives. "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet." The old English term for this day, Maundy Thursday, comes from the Anglo-French word "Maundy" derived from the Latin "mandatum," which means "commandment." The commandment to love and service lies at the heart of this day.

Friday of the Passion of the Lord is usually called Good Friday since it assured our redemption. The liturgy of the day is not a Mass – the only day of the year when no Mass is celebrated. We tell the story of the Lord's Passion, venerate the cross, receive Holy Communion which was consecrated the night before. In addition, we pray Solemn Intercessions on this day. These prayers remind us that the power of the Cross extends through all of creation.

The Easter Vigil is held on Holy Saturday. There are four parts to the celebration: blessed fire, the word of God, the baptismal ceremony, and the bread and the wine. The key word for this liturgy is "vigil." We are on the watch for what God is doing through the saving mysteries. The liturgy is deliberated extended – a blazing fire, many scripture readings, sacraments of initiation, full celebration of the Eucharist – to demonstrate that for all time things are different because of the Pascal Mystery. This night truly is different from all other nights.

Please attend as much of the Triduum as you can. The liturgies are transformative. We are all different because of these sacred events.
