

APRIL 21, 2019 EASTER SUNDAY

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Happy Easter! For my grandparents from Poland, Easter was the highlight of the year. Before the holiday the eggs would be carefully decorated. The entire

family would gather on Sunday after Church and there would be massive amounts of traditional foods to be eaten. The next day, Easter Monday, just when you are trying to digest all that kielbasa, someone would throw water on you. Yes, the day after Easter is Wet Monday. Everyone gets soaked.

The origins of this celebration are uncertain, but there is evidence of the custom before the fourteenth century. Many people assume that this celebration has its origin in one of the following:

From pagan mythology, most likely a link with the Slavic goddesses of fertility. The tradition of watering the Corn Mother, who made crops grow and was represented in the form of a doll or wreath made from corn. OR, Wet Monday is a commemoration of the birth of Christianity in Poland, when Holy Baptism was administered to the Prince Mieszko on Easter Monday. This act united all of Poland under the banner of Christianity. What most probably happened is that the Church "baptized" the pagan custom by wrapping it with a Christian origin story.

Nowadays, the Wet Monday tradition is most commonly practiced among boys and girls. What better way to flirt with someone you like than throw water on them! But everyone participates. Some Poles say that if you get splashed by water thrown on Wet Monday you will have good luck for the rest of the year.

For our purposes, this bit of cultural lore serves as a reminder of how important baptism is in the life of a Christian. In the early Church all baptisms were done on Easter for it is on Easter that we are most ourselves as Christians. We enter the "sea of death" with Jesus in the baptismal water only to rise with him as part of the white-robed army of saints gathered around the throne of God. The ancient tradition was that those who were to be baptized would face west and renounce Satan. Then on entering the water they would turn to the east, to the rising Sun of Easter morning to proclaim their new identity as partakers of the power of the Resurrection.

For us at St. James the font sits at the entry to the church to demonstrate that we are Christians through the waters of baptism. We "throw water" from the font on our heads every time we enter into Church as we make the sign of the cross. During the Easter season we will substitute our baptismal promises (with more water thrown in) for the recitation of the creed. At our baptism Christ named us and claimed us. By our baptism we become one body, the Body of Christ, bearing witness to the presence of God in the world. Through our baptism we are commissioned to nudge the Church a little further down the road on the way to becoming the Kingdom of God by creating a more peaceful. forgiving, charitable and just society. During this Easter season let us celebrate who we are and whose we are because we have been "washed and saved" in the baptismal waters. Happy Easter.
