

JULY 28, 2019 17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

According to the Bible, Acts 12:1-2, St. James, the leader of the Christians in Jerusalem, was killed in that city in the year 44 A.D. That is pretty much all the history that we know. So how did the apostle end up at Compostela in Spain? The 12th-century Historia Compostelana provides a summary of the legend of St. James, as it was believed at Compostela at that time. Two propositions are central to it: first, that St. James preached the gospel in Spain, as well as in the Holy Land. According to ancient local tradition, on 2 January AD 40, the Virgin Mary appeared to James while he was preaching the Gospel in Spain. She appeared upon a pillar, Nuestra

Señora del Pilar, and that pillar is conserved and venerated within the present Basilica of Our Lady of the Pillar, in Zaragoza, Spain. Following that apparition, St. James returned to Judea, where he was beheaded by King Herod Agrippa I in the year 44. The second proposition: after his martyrdom at the hands of Herod Agrippa, his disciples carried his body by sea to Iberia, where they landed on the coast of Galicia, then took it inland for burial at Santiago de Compostela. The translation of his



relics from Judea to Galicia in the northwest of Iberia was done, in legend, by a series of miraculous happenings: decapitated in Jerusalem, his body was taken up by angels, and sailed in a rudderless, unattended boat to Iria Flavia in Iberia, where a massive rock closed around his relics, which were later removed to Compostela. The tradition at Compostela placed the discovery of the relics of the saint in the time of King Alfonso II (791-842). These traditions were the basis for the pilgrimage route that began to be established in the 9th century, and the shrine dedicated to James at Santiago de Compostela, in Galicia in Spain, became the most famous pilgrimage site in the Christian world.

Modern scholars are somewhat skeptical about the legends. For one thing, St. Paul in his epistle to the Romans (Rom 15:20-24) talks about evangelizing in Spain because he doesn't want to build on "another's foundation." So if St. James did preach in Spain St. Paul knew nothing of it. The legendary elements (angels bringing an unattended boat!) raise a modern eyebrow with doubt. Historians also find it convenient that his tomb was discovered in the eighth century – just as the Christians in Spain needed a rallying point to push back the Muslim invaders (the Moors of North Africa) from the Iberian Peninsula. St. James, disciple of the Prince of Peace, became Santiago Matamoros (Saint James the Moorslayer). ¡Santiago, y cierra, España! ("St. James and strike for Spain") was the traditional battle cry of medieval Spanish (Christian) armies. The Spanish forces were finally successful in expelling the Moors in 1492 under the leadership of King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella who we know from the Columbus story.

Whatever the merits of the history and the legends we are grateful to have St. James for our patron. He symbolizes for us that we are always "on the way," on pilgrimage, in our journey of faith. Saint James, pray for us.


