

DECEMBER 15, 2019 3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

The season of Advent has three featured players: Isaiah, John the Baptist and Mary. This week and next the gospel readings will speak of John the Baptist. We can supplement what the Scripture says about John by looking at a contemporary history book written by Josephus in a book entitled: Antiquities of the Jews (book 18, chapter 5, 2).

Now some of the Jews thought that the destruction of Herod's [Antipas's] army came from God, and that very justly, as a punishment of what he did against John, that was called the Baptist: for Herod slew him, who was a good man, and commanded the Jews to exercise virtue, both as to righteousness towards one another, and piety towards God, and so to come to baptism; for that the washing [with water] would be acceptable to him, if they made use of it, not in order to the putting away [or the remission] of some sins [only], but for the purification of the body; supposing still that the soul was thoroughly purified beforehand by righteousness. Now when [many] others came in crowds about him, for they were very greatly moved [or pleased] by hearing his words, Herod, who feared lest the great influence John had over the people might put it into his power and inclination to raise a rebellion, (for they seemed ready to do anything he should advise,) thought it best, by putting him to death, to prevent any mischief he might cause, and not bring himself into difficulties. by sparing a man who might make him repent of it when it would be too late. Accordingly he was sent a prisoner, out of Herod's suspicious temper, to Macherus, the castle I before mentioned, and was there put to death. Now the Jews had an opinion that the destruction of this army was sent as a punishment upon Herod, and a mark of God's displeasure to him.

John the Baptist is, therefore, a prophet in the tradition of the Old Testament prophets defying political authorities who are working against God. He is also revered in Islam as a great prophet who greeted Muhammed during his ascension through the seven heavens. Of course, in the Bible the great significance of John was as the "precursor" of Jesus. John announces Jesus' coming and prepares the people for Jesus' ministry. Jesus himself identifies John as "Elijah who is to come", which some biblical scholars interpret to mean that Jesus believed that John was the reincarnation of the Old Testament prophet Elijah, although John the Baptist in the Gospel of John explicitly denies being linked to Elijah (John 1:21).

Some scholars maintain that John belonged to the Essenes, a semiascetic Judaic sect who expected a Hebrew messiah and who practiced ritual baptism. John used baptism as the central symbol or sacrament of his pre-messianic movement. John baptized Jesus and some of Jesus' early followers had previously been followers of John.

We all have a little of John the Baptist in us in letting people know that Jesus is the reason for the season.


