

ON THE WAY.....

THIS WEEK AT ST. JAMES



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Holy Week. Last year all of the liturgies of Holy Week were via Zoom. It was very strange not to gather as a Christian Community to celebrate the Sacred Mysteries at the heart of our faith. No palms to distribute, no feet to wash, no bread broken and cup shared, no cross to kiss, no candles to hold, no baptisms to perform. The virtual ceremonies gave us just a dim approximation of how Holy Week is to be commemorated – being with Jesus as he goes through his humiliation, suffering and ultimate death. This year, because of social distancing and the need to keep things sanitary, we will still not be able to participate in many of the rituals which provide special meaning to these days. Since we won't have those symbolic, communal actions to guide our prayer we are challenged to do some personal reflection on the significance of the events we remember this week.

Palm Sunday. The shift from "Hosanna" during the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to "Crucify him" proclaimed this year in the Passion Narrative by St. Mark is so dramatic a contrast that it causes spiritual whiplash. The gospel suggests that it was "the crowds," the same people who were waving palms on Sunday that were waving fists on Friday. Our prayer might be how we too can quickly shift from our sincere intention for following Jesus to actions which drain away whatever virtue we have managed to acquire. We need some spiritual equilibrium.

Holy Thursday. While we cannot gather around the table with our friends as Jesus did we can imitate his action of humble service. For example, we can give up some of our "me time" and call someone who might need a word of comfort. We can't physically wash each other's feet but we can reach out in compassion to those who are hurting all around us. What is the need that you are seeing that you might be able to address in some way?

Good Friday. Embracing the cross as the liturgy calls for will look different this year. Instead of a physical encounter with "the wood" we have the opportunity to heed the word of the Lord and "pick up your cross each day" (Luke 9:23). Can we experience our crosses not as burdens but as blessings?

Holy Saturday. All is stillness on Holy Saturday. There is no liturgy to break the silence of the tomb. What a perfect day to spend time in the quiet, in the stillness. Instead of busying ourselves we can take a step back and simply wait on what the Lord might want to reveal to us.

Perhaps we enter the portal into a deeper experience of Holy Week by

understanding that Jesus, the suffering servant, "did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for the many" (Mark 10:45). Holy Week is our invitation to join with the Lord in loving service.
