

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

This Thursday, February 2, which is liturgically called "Feast of the Presentation of the Lord," has been known in the past as Candlemas. Candlemas or the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ or the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Christian holiday commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple. (As an aside, this is not the feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated on November 21 who is the patroness of community of Sister Barbara and Sister Janet.) This feast is based upon the account of the presentation of Jesus in Luke 2:22–40. In accordance with Leviticus 12, a woman was to be purified by presenting a lamb as a burnt offering, and either a young pigeon or dove as sin offering, 33 days after a boy's circumcision. Since Jesus circumcision was held eight days after his birth on December 25 (that is, January 1), 2 February is traditionally celebrated as the 40th day (postpartum period) of and the conclusion of the Christmas–Epiphany season. While it is customary for Christians in some countries to remove their Christmas decorations at Epiphany, other Christian countries wait to remove them at Candlemas. On Candlemas, it has been a tradition to bring candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year. These blessed candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ, who is the Light of the World.

Many countries celebrate Candlemas more than does the US. In the British Isles February 2 is when leases were renewed, rents were paid and interest was due. Readers of English novels will recognize Candlemas as the beginning of the Spring term at ancient universities. In France, Candlemas is the day to eat crepes. Their round shape and golden color, reminiscent of the sun, refer to the return of spring after the dark and cold of winter. (In the English speaking world that custom has moved to having pancakes at Mardi Gras.) Candelaria is celebrated in many Spanish speaking countries. Puerto Rico has a major devotion to Nuestra Señora de Candelaria (Our Lady of the Light) whose statue is carried on the shoulders in procession. Others follow with lit candles until they reach the church where a mass is celebrated. In the evening, the festivities may continue with a giant bonfire and singing. In Mexico the people celebrate Nino Jesus (Baby Jesus) and eat tamales!

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. This feast which celebrates Christ our light serves to remind us that those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples.

And, of course, in the US we call February 2 Groundhog Day and look on Punxsutawney Phil to tell us whether we are going to have a long winter or not. From the sublime to the ridiculous on this day.
