

#### ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Yesterday, March 25, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Annunciation. Nine months before the birth of Jesus, Mary conceived in her womb the child who would be both Son of God and Son of Mary. This occurred because of her positive response ("Be it done unto me according to your word") to the word of the Angel Gabriel announcing (the annunciation) God's plan for her. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High" (Luke 1:30-32). This feast is considered one of the most important on the Church's calendar. In fact, when the current system of calendar was created in the 6th century (Anno Domini or A.D.) March 25 was considered New Year's day. In England, the feast of the Annunciation came to be known as Lady Day, and Lady Day marked the beginning of the English new year until 1752.

The Annunciation was an important part of Catholic Piety through a prayer known as the Angelus. The prayer is a series of verses and responses interspersed with Hail Marys. The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary, R/. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Hail Mary..... Behold the handmaid of the Lord, R/. Be it done unto me according to your Word. Hail Mary... And the Word was made flesh, R/. And dwelt among us. Hail Mary... Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, R/. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Let us pray. Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts: that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen. The Angelus has been traditionally said three times daily, at 6 am, noon and 6 pm accompanied by the ringing of a bell (the Angelus bell). Of course you can pray the prayer at any time.

The Annunciation has been the topic of many great paintings throughout history. Depictions of the Annunciation go back to early Christianity, with the Priscilla catacomb including the oldest known fresco of the Annunciation, dating to the 4th century. Works on the subject have been created by artists such as Sandro Botticelli, Leonardo da Vinci, Caravaggio, Michelangelo, Rafael, Henry Ossawa Tanner, Jan van Eyck, and Murillo among others. There are famous mosaics, frescos and statues depicting the Annunciation as well.

All this attention is lavished on the Annunciation because it deals with the crucial event of human history – the Incarnation, God becoming one with us in the flesh. As the traditional prayer for the feast from Saint Athanasius (+373) puts it: "Today is the beginning of our salvation, and the revelation of the eternal mystery! The Son of God becomes the Son of the Virgin as Gabriel announces the coming of Grace."
