ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is "Good Shepherd Sunday." The Gospel is taken from John 10 – this year being Year A, the first ten verses are proclaimed. In Years B and C the rest of chapter 10 which speak of different aspects of the Good Shepherd are assigned for those Sunday. The Responsorial is taken from Psalm 23 which is probably the best loved of the psalms. It is very common to use Psalm 23 at a funeral because of its consoling message.

Jesus doubtless chose the image of a Good Shepherd because those who were hearing him would know what he was talking about. They saw shepherds woven into their everyday lives and could understand what the metaphor implied. I have to admit that for your humble servant who grew up in a row home in Baltimore that shepherds were not part of my world. Being a shepherd was not every day but as exotic as being an astronaut or ship captain. However, a few years ago I was visiting rural Mexico about two hours outside of Mexico City. While taking a walk up in the hills I came across a flock of sheep. They were all grazing on whatever grass was available as the moved toward the "green pastures." What was surprising to me was that the shepherd was NOT in the front leading them. Instead, he was behind the flock. When a particular sheep started wandering off too far from the rest he would send the dog to corral it back to the fold. When a sheep was lagging behind he would use his "crook and staff" to push it to catch up with the others. The flock was being pushed in the right direction but the leadership of the shepherd was from behind, that way he could keep watch over the whole group.

That image of how a shepherd operates says something about leadership in the Church. Bishops and Pastors are not infantry commanders saying "follow me" into unknown territory. As shepherds their role is to keep the people together and push the faithful in the right direction but to let them find their own way of getting there. The faithful are not mindless followers but those who are on their own path toward the "restful waters."

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of this day is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray that young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord's call to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life.

Tomorrow, May 1, we remember St. Joseph, the Worker. The feast was added to the liturgical calendar as a response to communist countries who celebrate Labor Day on May 1. The Church is committed to supporting the working men and women of the world and ensuring that they have adequate wages, safe and healthy working conditions and meaningful work. This might be a good day to thank those who work in your building, in the store, around the neighborhood for all that they do to make our city a better place.




