ON THE WAY.....

May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

You would think with the coming of summer that things would slow down. They haven't yet, at least for me. I came across this passage from a book by Henri Nouwen, *Making All Things New*, which captured what I've been feeling. And not just me, even retired people report they have similar feelings. Nouwen reflects on the of the commandments of Jesus: Thou shalt not worry. "Your heavenly Father knows what you need. Set your hearts on his kingdom first and all these things will be given you as well" (Matt 6:33).

"One of the most obvious characteristics of our daily lives is that we are busy. We experience our days as filled with things to do, people to meet, projects to finish, letters to write, calls to make, and appointments to keep. In fact, we are almost always aware of being behind schedule. There is a nagging sense that there are unfinished tasks, unfulfilled promises, unrealized proposals. There is always something else that we should have remembered, done, or said. There are always people we did not speak to, write to, or visit. Thus, although we are very busy, we also have a lingering feeling of never really fulfilling our obligations. The strange thing, however, is that it is very hard not to be busy. People expect us to be busy and to have many things on our minds. Often our friends say to us, "I guess you are busy, as usual," and mean it as a compliment. They reaffirm the general assumption that it is good to be busy.... More enslaving than our occupations, however, are our preoccupations. To be pre-occupied means to fill our time and place long before we are there. This is worrying in a more specific sense of the word. It is a mind filled with "ifs..." All these "ifs" fill our minds with anxious thoughts and make us wonder constantly what to do and what to say in case something should happen in the future... Our individual as well as communal lives are so deeply molded by our worries about tomorrow that today hardly can be experienced... Our occupations and preoccupations fill our external lives and internal lives to the brim. They prevent the Spirit of God from breathing freely in us and thus renewing our lives... Jesus' response to our worry-filled lives is to shift the point of gravity, to relocate the center of our attention, to change our priorities. Jesus wants us to move from the "many things" to the "one necessary thing." Jesus does not speak about a change of activities, a change in contacts, or even a change of pace. He speaks about a change of heart. This change of heart makes everything different, even while everything appears to remain the same... When we worry, we have our hearts in the wrong place. Jesus asks us to move our hearts to the center, where all other things fall into place. What is this center? Jesus calls it the kingdom of God... To set our hearts of the kingdom means to make the life of the Spirit within and among us the center of what we think, say, or do."


