

ON THE WAY.....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Making an annual retreat is part of the ongoing spiritual practice of a Missionary Servant of the Most Holy Trinity. By custom the retreat should be eight days, although sometimes it is limited to five. There are two basic types of retreats. A preached retreat consists of the retreat master giving a series of conferences or talks (usually from one to three a day) about a spiritual theme to the entire group. Each retreatant will then take the input he has received and reflect in his private prayer time on how the material applies to his own life. The other type of retreat is called "directed." Each retreatant is assigned a spiritual director or guide and works with the director of the days on scriptural or other themes to promote his/ her growth in the Spirit. The retreatant will have four or five private prayer sessions each with the material. He brings the fruit of his/her prayer to the spiritual director and suggestions are made for the next day's prayer. In recent years in both types of retreats there is time for faith sharing on the part of the retreatants. They gather together a few times during the retreat and bring to the group the fruit of their prayer. Since the Holy Spirit is present in the group there can be a richness is hearing how the Spirit is moving among them.

A major feature of any retreat is silence. Quieting one's external communication aims at promoting an interior dialogue with the Holy Spirit. For monks the silence is customary but for those who are in active communities this silence can be a challenge. It seems odd to be sharing a table and meal and not talking with the fellow diners. In addition, often one's fellow retreatants are friends and classmates you have not seen for years since your assignments have been to different countries or different areas in the United States. Naturally you want to catch up! But shutting out external noise from this world provides the occasion for an entry into the realm of the Holy Spirit.

The patron saint of retreats is St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. He developed a lengthy retreat that he called the Spiritual Exercises as the tool to form men into Jesuits. The Spiritual Exercises last for four weeks and consist of a series of reflections on the story of Jesus life, death and resurrection. Taking that intense time in prayer enables the retreatant to see things in a whole new light. The retreat ends with the retreatant praying to God: "Give me only your love and your grace. That's enough for me." Many religious traditions have used Ignatius' method as a model for their own retreats. We call ours "the Missionary Cenacle Spiritual Exercises."

My retreat this year is in Holy Trinity, Alabama. This is "Bethlehem" for the Missionary Servants. It was here that one hundred years ago Father Judge founded two religious communities, one of men and one of women. Going back there always refreshes my soul and renews my Spirit.

St. James Food Pantry is currently looking for your help. We are asking for volunteers to help on


