

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

If you ever went to Vacation Bible School you probably learned the song: "I've got that joy, joy, joy, joy down in my heart, down in my heart to stay. For I'm so happy, so very happy, I've got the love of Jesus in my heart." The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called by its Latin title, Laetare Sunday, which translates as the "Sunday to rejoice." We are in the midst of Lent so rejoicing might not seem to be an obvious action to take. Why should we rejoice while during Lenten fasting? Doesn't joy only come when things are going right? The liturgy teaches otherwise. There is a song in *Fiddler on the Roof* which captures this liturgical moment. "God would like us to be joyful, Even when our hearts lie panting on the floor. But how much more can we be joyful When there's really something to be joyful for?" Joy is a condition which is not dependent on events swirling around it.

We tend to think of the English words happiness and joy in the same way – as feelings when our hearts are lifted up and we feel that all is well. Perhaps that is the way to think about happiness but not the way the Bible thinks about joy. Think of a parent: when their child does well in school or in sports they are happy. It fills their hearts with warm feelings. However, think of a mother holding her newborn in her arms. The child has not done anything yet, in fact is the cause of constant effort and worry. Yet the warm feeling in her heart comes about simply because of the very presence of the child. That is joy.

The instinct of the liturgy is that we need to be reminded even during Lent that as believers we are made for joy. Things might be going to hell in a handbasket all around us but we know that God is still God, that there is a plan at work, that love is stronger than death, that all will be well. Our hearts can rest joyfully in God no matter the external circumstance because of the blessed assurance that we are the children of God, precious in God's sight, beloved from the first moment of our existence.

If you are anything like me the initial enthusiasm with which you entered your Lenten practices has waned. I find myself fudging on the things I committed myself to do during the season. This Sunday is an invitation to enter into these final weeks of the season with a renewed spirit. We aren't simply slogging through Lent waiting for it to end. We go through the season in order to re-capture that joy that comes in living more consciously in the presence of God. All of our Lenten practices should focus us more closely on the God who formed us in our mothers' wombs and will one day call us to abide with him forever. No wonder this is a season of Joy!


