

## ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Because McCormick Place is close to St. James (actually within our parish boundaries) we frequently get visitors who are at a conference or convention. Last week one such guest from California sent me a note of appreciation. She wrote: "I was visiting St James last Sunday and the warmth and love I felt and (Support) has inspired me... Oh my God, it was one of the extraordinary experiences I've ever had. I wish I was close. Please keep me in mind. I do miss you guys. It was an extraordinary experience." First of all, thanks to all of you who regularly reach out to welcome those who are visiting St. James. You never know what effect a casual word of greeting and interest in another person can produce. Staying alert and welcoming those who are new to the parish is part of our core identity as a parish. This is not something that a committee or ministry does but something we all do. Being a welcoming parish is part of our brand.

Second, there is a dynamic in a group (like a parish) where some feel like insiders and some feel like outsiders. Insiders are those who feel engaged. They are active in the community. They have friendships with others in the group. On the other hand, there are those who come regularly but who feel like outsiders. There are parishioners who look like insiders but who feel like they are alone, not included. They feel like they are never invited or encouraged. We work hard to make sure that true outsiders, those who are visiting or coming for the first time, feel included. We need to do a better job making sure that we do not treat those who are in fact insiders as outsiders. The Church community must help one another to recognize their gifts and talents and find ways for people to grow and develop those gifts. Make an effort to get to know someone you see regularly so that everyone knows that they belong.

Finally, and this is the challenge of creating a culture of evangelization, St. James needs to broaden our spirit of welcome outside of the four walls of the Church. Pope Francis has challenged Catholics to think of themselves as responsible for the mission of the Church. It is not the role of the priests and religious but all of the faithful are called to be apostles in light of our baptismal anointing. Pope Francis wrote: "All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith are agents of evangelization, and it would be insufficient to envisage a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipient." This means that we not only welcome people who come into Church, we also invite others to experience what we have as Church. In a culture of evangelization, parishioners are invested in the life of the Church community and are empowered to intentionally and personally invite others into a relationship with Jesus and his Church and in so doing, let those they invite know that they belong. More on this theme in the weeks ahead!


