May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

June 30 is the end of the fiscal year for churches in the Archdiocese of Chicago. We will be working on the end of the year report, present it to the Finance Council and share it with you in the months ahead. Thank you for your generous support of St. James over the past year, and years. The next major project we are looking at for St. James is putting air conditioning in the Church. We have applied to the Covid Relief Fund for an Employee Retention Credit. (Employers who kept workers on during the pandemic can be eligible for a cash credit for helping keeping the economy going during those months.) If this comes through we should be able to begin the project.

June 30 is the day when our outreach to the newly arriving immigrants steps up a notch. We will baptize several children and have several others make their First Holy Communion today. As we get to know these refugees and they get to know us we will become a richer community at St. James as our spirit of hospitality embraces a new people and culture.

Speaking of hospitality, the first Mass for the SPRED community at St. James will be held on September 8 at 11:30am. Just a reminder: SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program of the Archdiocese of Chicago *which trains and guides parishes to provide faith formation to persons with developmental disabilities and/or learning problems and become integrated into parish life. This is accomplished through small communities of faith at the parish level.* The local SPRED community has been meeting at the old St. John Nepomucene church in Bridgeport. The Church there is not viable going forward so SPRED is being welcomed to St. James. Their liturgy will be held at 11:30am twice a month. The other Sundays of the month the 11:30AM Mass will be coordinated by the regular St. James liturgy committee. All parishioners are invited to Mass on the SPRED Sundays and we will welcome the SPRED community on the other Sundays.

June 30 is also the day when St. James makes our annual pilgrimage to St. Edna's Parish in Arlington Heights, one of our sharing parishes. For many years St. Edna's has been a supporter of the St. James Food Pantry. They come to St. James for African-American Heritage Sunday and we reciprocate in May or June. Sharing parishes are what make the Food Pantry possible. St. Edna's provides regular donations during the year of money and dry goods. Members from St. Edna serve on the Social Concern Board. Our Lady of Perpetual Help also provides financial assistance and service on the Board. They reach out to needy families particularly at Christmas as does Faith, Hope and Charity Parish. Parishioners from our neighbor, Old St. Mary's, volunteer at the food pantry in addition to the financial contribution made by the parish. The bottom line: the St. James Food Pantry has the support of these and other churches and individuals which enable us to offer the broad spectrum of care we provide. Thanks to all of them.
