ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Catholic Social Teaching has addressed the concern that capitalism's goal, to make a profit, not be achieved by exploiting workers. As far back as 1891 Pope Leo XIII suggested that one remedy for this occurring was the strengthening of labor unions. Pope Leo recognized that organized labor was the only reliable way to protect the rights, safety, and well-being of workers and their families. History has proven the wisdom of this position. Unions led to the creation of a five-day work week, eight-hour work day, pensions and benefits for families, living wages for workers, and safe working conditions. In a Church committed to human dignity the labor union is a powerful tool.

Pope John Paul II, an explicit enemy to Communism, also warned about the excesses which could be present in capitalism. In his 1981 encyclical, Laborem Exercens (On Human Work), the pope calls for the rights of workers through a just wage, adequate rest, safe working conditions, unemployment benefits, injury and disability subsidies, pensions and parental leave, and work that upholds moral integrity and personal dignity. Unions, like any human institution, can become corrupt, but they are necessary to balance the playing field. Pope Benedict XVI echoed this thinking in his 2009 encyclical, Charity in Truth.

Pope Francis has continued this tradition that upholding the rights of working people will need to include unions. In the struggle against what Pope Francis calls an "economy that kills," Catholics must decide how to uphold human dignity. Unions may be imperfect, but as Pope Leo XIII and John Paul II pointed out, they are a reliable way to protect the rights of workers. Catholic social teaching supports the right of workers to choose whether to organize, join a union, and bargain collectively, and to exercise these rights without reprisal. Workers, owners, employers, and unions should work together to create decent jobs, build a more just economy, and advance the common good.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops issues annual Labor Day statements which continue the long tradition of support for workers' right to organize and join unions. In 2018, the statement stressed the importance of just wages for workers, especially for those who have difficulty securing basic needs. It also discussed problems of income inequality between the wealthy and the poor, as well as between ethnic groups and between the sexes. "This Labor Day, let us all commit ourselves to personal conversion of heart and mind and stand in solidarity with workers by advocating for just wages, and in so doing, 'bring glad tidings to the poor'," the bishops' message concluded.

The Catholic Labor Network, based at Georgetown University, is a place for Catholics — lay, religious and clergy — who find inspiration in Catholic Social Teaching on labor and work, and wish to share it with the world. The Network exchanges information about the Church and social justice and to support working people in their struggles. It promotes the cause of workers and Catholic social teaching in labor unions, parishes and other organizations. To learn more about this organization you can go to Catholiclabor.org.


Greetings, Fellow Parishioners!
