

### ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

There are eighteen (!) feasts of Mary that are part of the universal calendar of the Church, that is, the feasts that are celebrated around the world. (There are other, local feasts of Mary that celebrate some particular devotion. For example, Our Lady of Divine Providence is the patronal feast of Puerto Rico and also commemorated in St. Mary of the Woods, Indiana.) Some of the feasts of Mary recall Biblical events, for example the Annunciation and the Visitation. There are other times the Church remembers some aspect of Mary's life which, while not mentioned in the Bible, can be assumed such as the birth of Mary and her presentation. Other feasts remember the doctrines of Mary, for example the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption. Then there are the feasts that point toward some appearance of Mary like our Lady of Lourdes and Our Lady of Fatima. Recently added feasts of Mary include Mother of God on January 1 and Mother of the Church which Pope Francis put on the Calendar to be celebrated on the Monday after Pentecost as an expression of the role Mary played in keeping the disciples of Jesus together in the Upper Room awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Two of the Marian feasts have the odd origin of placing this peasant girl from Galilee as the leader of victorious armies! This week, October 7, is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast day was originally called Our Lady of Victory because it was placed on the calendar after the victory of the Christian Navy over the Turks. In 1571, Pope Pius V organized a coalition of forces to rescue Christian outposts in the Mediterranean. On 7 October 1571, the Holy League, a coalition of Catholic maritime states met a powerful Ottoman fleet in the Battle of Lepanto. Knowing that the Christian forces were at a distinct material disadvantage, Pope Pius V called for all of Europe to pray the Rosary for victory and led a rosary procession in Rome. Pius V instituted the feast of Our Lady of Victory in order to commemorate the victory at Lepanto, which he attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The name of the day was subsequently changed to Our Lady of the Rosary.

Another Marian feast which grew out of a war is the Feast of the Holy Name of Mary. The Turks were again threatening Europe in the seventeenth century. The Turkish armies had moved through the Balkans, Bulgaria and Hungary and were at the gates of Vienna. Again, the cry went out for Christian forces to save the city. In 1683, the Polish king John Sobieski, arrived at Vienna with his army. Before the Battle of Vienna, Sobieski placed his troops under the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the following year, to celebrate the victory, Pope Innocent XI added the feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary to the Roman calendar. It is now celebrated on September 12<sup>th</sup>. Whatever the origin of this or any other of the feasts of Mary, Catholic tradition has always counted on Mary to be a powerful intercessor for those who are followers of her son, Jesus.




# NETWORK's Nuns on the Bus & Friends will be Old St. Patrick's Church on Tuesday, October 8 at 6 PM.
