ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

September 29th is the feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel and Raphael — a trio of protection, healing, and petition for those who ask for their intercession. Because this is a Sunday, the feast will not be celebrated this year. But it is good to remember the role these angels played in the Bible. For example, St. Michael the Archangel is hailed in the Book of Daniel as "the great prince who has charge of [God's] people." Michael's history in the Bible is depicted through Daniel, in Jude (in which he battles Satan for possession of Moses' body), and in Revelation as he wages war with the dragon alongside his fellow angels. Rabbinic tradition holds that Michael was at the center of many of the great biblical dramas even if not explicitly mentioned. Long time Catholics will remember a prayer to St. Michael that used to be said at the end of Mass. This custom was abandoned at the reforms of Vatican II. However, Pope John Paul II in 1994 urged Catholics to make the prayer to St. Michael a regular part of their lives so some churches have revived the custom. St. Michael is the patron saint of the military, police and firemen, those who work in dangerous conditions and the Boy Scouts.

Saint Gabriel appears regularly in Scripture as a messenger of God's word, both in the Old and New Testaments. Daniel identifies Gabriel as a "man" who came "to give insight and understanding," relaying prophetic answers to Daniel's entreaties to God. In the New Testament, Luke relays Gabriel's appearances to both Zechariah and the Virgin Mary. At the former, he informs the priest that his wife, Elizabeth, will soon conceive a child; at the latter he informs Mary herself that she will do the same. The two children in question, of course, were respectively John the Baptist and Jesus Christ. Christian tradition further associates Gabriel with the apostle Paul's reference in his First Letter to the Thessalonians to the "archangel's call" and "the sound of the trump." Hence, we hear references in history to Gabriel's trumpet. Since Gabriel is the one who brings God's messages, he is the patron of preachers, postal workers, diplomats, broadcasters and all those who work in electronic media.

The story of St. Raphael, depicted in the Book of Tobit, is something unique in the Bible. In other depictions of angels, they come to Earth only briefly, to deliver a message or to help God's favored people in some way. Raphael stays around for the whole story, and by the end he's become something more than an angel ... he's become a friend. In Tobit, Raphael accompanies Tobias, the son of the book's namesake, as he travels to retrieve money left by his father in another town, helping him along the way and arranging for his marriage to Sarah. Notably, Raphael deftly uses the natural world to work God's miracle, particularly healing the blindness of Tobit. He is the patron of single people, of pharmacists because he provided the salve of healing, of blind people, travelers, sick people, and youth.


