

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Life at St. James has a certain rhythm. We do our rounds of prayers and masses, prepare people to receive the sacraments, offer opportunities to learn more about the faith, provide religious education for the children, and outreach to the elderly. In addition, St. James operates a very expansive food pantry that provides groceries to almost 2000 families each month, delivers food to the homebound and offers a bag lunch for the homeless four days a week. The "third leg" of our mission is the campus ministry offered to Illinois Institute of Technology, Illinois College of Optometry and Vandercook College of Music. We have added to our usual operations this year the presence of the SPRED community who provide an opportunity for those who are mentally disabled to offer their voices in prayer and praise. And, the presence of newly arrived immigrants to our neighborhood compelled us to offer religious and other humanitarian services to our brothers and sisters who speak Spanish.

In addition to these patterns of regular life, St. James is ramping up our efforts at Evangelization. It has become clear that the old ways of being Church – "if you build it, they will come" – no longer work. We must instead meet people where they are, asking their questions and responding to their spiritual longings. This involves going into the local community in ways that show that the Church has something to offer them. Our evangelization efforts are beginning with a program called Sycamore where anyone is invited to share a meal and conversation about topics that are close to one's heart. The concrete way each of us can contribute to this effort is through prayer. We can pray to support our efforts to spread the gospel individually or with the parish prayer group.

St. James has also been chosen to participate in the Archdiocesan wide capital campaign called Generation to Generation. We have had an initial series of meetings with those running the campaign about what will be involved for us. (If you remember ten years ago the Archdiocese ran a similar campaign entitled To Teach Who Christ Is.) The idea behind the campaign is that parishioners will pledge over a five-year period to support efforts of the Archdiocese and the parish which go beyond the normal running of operations. Much more on this in the months ahead.

Then we can't forget that every year at this time the Archdiocese conducts the Annual Catholic Appeal, called this year "Together we bring hope." Each parish is given an assessment based on our parish income to support the larger Church. Last year monies from this collection provided support to Catholic schools, particularly with scholarships to Catholic education for disadvantaged families, to underwrite the education of those in the seminary preparing for priesthood, to run the offices of Divine Worship, Lifelong Formation and Parish Renewal, and to provide funds to Catholic Relief Services which is the Church's arm around the world of for economics assistance particularly in times of major disasters. If you have contributed in the past you have doubtless heard about this appeal already. It will be introduced to the parish at large next Sunday.




