ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Over the years you might have heard the term RCIA – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This describes the process the Church uses in bringing adults into the Catholic Church. Last year the US Bishops (following the norms of the Holy See) started using the term OCIA - the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults since there are several rites which are part of the process. Today at St. James we will celebrate one of those rites: the Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election. The highlight of the rite is the signing of the Book of the Elect. (The term, "catechumen," refers to those who have never been baptized and have been preparing themselves for the reception of the Sacraments.) Evelyn, who has been part of the OCIA community for the past year will be recognized as in the final stages of formation as she prepares for Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. Later today another of the rites will be celebrated at Holy Name Cathedral: the Rite of Election of Catechumens. Evelyn will join with those from other parishes around the Archdiocese for a public reception by the bishop of their candidacy for incorporation into the Church through baptism. During the rest of the Sundays of Lent other rites - called the scrutinies – will be celebrated as prayerful preparation for the Easter Sacraments.

Some background: the restoration of the catechumenate was one of the happiest of the liturgical reforms prompted by Vatican Council II. The Council Fathers realized that the mission of the Church was not limited to non-Christian lands but included the entire world. The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults was designed not only to prepare individuals for the reception of the sacraments but also to help Christian communities in their evangelizing task. As the document states the purpose of the process is so that "adults who, upon hearing the proclamation of the mystery of Christ as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts, consciously and freely seek the living God and undertake the journey of faith and conversion. By God's power and in their own preparation, they will be strengthened with spiritual help and at the proper time will fruitfully receive these sacraments."

"[The elect], having been incorporated into Christ through Baptism, are formed into the People of God, and, having received the remission of all their sins and been rescued from the power of darkness, they are brought to the status of adopted sons and daughters, being made a new creation by water and the Holy Spirit. Hence they are called, and indeed they are, children of God. Sealed with the gift of the same Spirit in Confirmation, they are more perfectly configured to the Lord and filled with the Holy Spirit... Finally, participating in the Eucharistic assembly they eat the Flesh and drink the blood of the Son of Man, so that they may receive eternal life and show forth the unity of God's people... Thus, the three Sacraments of Christian Initiation so work together that they bring to full stature the Christian faithful, who exercise in the Church and in the world the mission of the entire Christian people."




