



EASTER SUNDAY

DOMINGO DE PASCUA

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

Catholics are accustomed to thinking of the season of Lent. The forty days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday are marked by some spiritual practice to prepare us for the feast of Easter. To a lesser extent we notice the season of Advent – the four weeks preceding Christmas. Unfortunately, while we acknowledge the season liturgically the flurry of preparations for Christmas make it difficult in our culture to honor Advent. We are less used to thinking of the fifty days of the Easter season, the seven weeks between Easter and Pentecost. For us, Easter is more of a one off, celebrate the day, eat the chocolate ears of the Easter bunny and move on. The Church instead offers us the Easter season as the occasion to let the true meaning of Christ's resurrection sink deep into our being and impact our life of faith. In fact, the Church treats the octave of Easter, the eight days from Easter to the following Sunday, as one continuing celebration.

For Christians, Easter is a season of blessing and celebration, the time to reflect on the new reality of post-Easter existence. We live in a new age because of the Risen Jesus. Easter teaches us to trust that Christ is with us always as our Risen Lord. No matter what we are going through, we can rely on the grace and power of the resurrection. As St. Paul puts it, "If we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him" (Romans 6:8). Since that is so, we are called to witness to the "good news" of the resurrection to all the people who are woven into our lives.

However, witnessing is not something that we do naturally as Catholics. In fact, in the face of all the suffering and trouble we see in the world, proclaiming the triumph of Christ over sin and death which is the meaning of the Resurrection can seem a stretch. Even we as believers are tempted to ask where God is in the midst of all of suffering. If Jesus is truly alive and triumphant over the forces of darkness why is there so much turmoil in the world? We are given these fifty days to stop and reflect on the signs of the presence of the Risen Christ in our lives no matter what is going on around us. Yes, faith can be shaken (witness Doubting Thomas!) but Easter provides the blessed assurance that God isn't finished yet, that Christ with us means that all will be well. We place our hope in the Risen Lord.

Those who have been preparing for baptism over the past year in OCIA move in the fifty days of Easter into what is called "mystagogy," the interpretation of the meaning of the pascal events. We can all join with them as we pray over and study the Scriptural texts which are offered during this season. Maybe we can make an Easter resolution, not so much to give up chocolate, but to share our experience of the Christian life as followers of Jesus whom we embrace as the source of life and love.


Confidentiality is important to us. Come when you're ready. Leave when you please.
