

May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

At a previous parish someone approached me and asked, "Does this church celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday." I answered, "Every Sunday is divine mercy Sunday here." Calling the octave day of Easter, known liturgically as the Second Sunday of Easter, the Sunday of Divine Mercy is of recent vintage in the Church. The designation is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000 agreed to comply with the request and this Sunday as been called Divine Mercy Sunday ever since. (It helps promote your cause if you have a fellow countryman as Pope!) Mercy permeates all that God does for us and this Sunday provides the occasion to recognize that it is mercy of God which moves us beyond the troubles we go through and into the divine presence.


During these weeks after Easter the first reading is not taken from the Old Testament as is customary during the rest of the year but instead from the Acts of the Apostles. In doing so the lectionary highlights that the Easter event was not simply that happened to Jesus as the Risen Lord. Rather, Easter changed the minds and hearts of Jesus' disciples as well. From fear-filled deniers and deserters they became bold proclaimers of the good news of Jesus. All of the tragedy and suffering in the world – violence, war, poverty, abuse, hatred – were not changed by the Easter story but the followers of Jesus were. They trusted that the God who raised Jesus from the dead could make a way out of no way. The seeming finality of Good Friday was reversed on Easter Sunday. This gave the disciples the blessed assurance that no matter what they were going through that God could make a way for them. The apostles and disciples went out to invite others to follow Jesus out of compassion. The people of the world, then and now, can find hope in the good news that sin and death do not get the last word, that love is stronger than death.

Of course, the Church tells the story of the first followers of Jesus spreading the word of Jesus and inviting others to join with them not for our admiration but for our imitation. The world of today is as messed up as the world was in the time of Jesus. People need what we have: the faith that God is love, the awareness of Jesus extending a hand of mercy to everyone, the understanding that we are all children of God made in God's image and likeness, the appreciation that treating one another with compassion, generosity and forgiveness puts us on the side of the angels. As we go through the Easter season and hear the Acts of the Apostles describe how faith in Jesus spread, let us resolve to do what we can to make Jesus better known and loved in our circle of care.
