ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

There are many songs about April. "April Showers," by Frank Sinatra, "April Love," by Pat Boone, "April in Paris," by Ella Fitzgerald, "April Come She Will," by Simon and Garfunkel pop readily into mind. When you google songs about April another seventeen that I didn't know popped up... (at least partly because my repertoire of songs ends around 1969.) Google had seven songs about March but I didn't recognize any of them. Apparently, singers like the new life, possibility, hopefulness, sunshine of April more than the blustery, variable, unpredictable, gloom of March. April in the Northern Hemisphere is the time of new life, how fitting that Easter usually occurs in this month. Walk by the parish farm and see the green beginnings of growth burst out of the soil. The liturgical season and the weather outside coincide nicely. (I wonder how Easter feels in Australia?) As we enter this month we can anticipate the celebrations to come.

However, there are still two weeks of Lent left! If you are anything like me, the resolutions we began with such fervor on Ash Wednesday have faded over the weeks. Perhaps that is why in the pre-Vatican II days the fifth Sunday of Lent began what was called the Passiontide, to give us a boost. The statues in the church used to be covered with purple cloth to focus on the saving events of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. The death of Jesus provides us the occasion to bring the reality of death into our prayer. As a society we don't reflect much on death. One book reflecting an influential sociological study is called "The Denial of Death," by Ernest Becker. But our Lenten journey into the desert invites us to turn to the darkest parts of our lives and meet them head on. The Biblical message, the Lenten message, is that God brings life out of death. Jesus used a parable to describe how a seed has to go into the ground and die in order to have new life grow from it. That is, of course, the story of his own passion where he laid down his life in death so that eternal life can be given to us. As we think about death, our own and those whom we love, we are not filled with dread but with a blessed assurance that God brings us into a new kind of living.

Besides plain old biological death, we experience things dying all the time. We find an old friendship has died due to politics, or our dreams for our family has died as people have grown and changed, or our self-understanding has died when we face our unhealthy behaviors, or our security has died when we lose our job or the economy takes a turn for the worse. Just as the pascal mystery of Jesus applies to our physical lives, so we can trust that same pattern will help us make it through the other kinds of death we endure. God makes a way out of no way. Let us spend these last two weeks of Lent looking through the darkness, anticipating the light to come. April love!


